


Brazil – strikes in June this year in 7 ports around the country. More than 50% of Brazil's GDP is within the port's surroundings creating significant impact to trade and political strife.






Port of Rotterdam widening its channels to allow ships to pass each other and avoid waiting times for inbound unloading. Estimated completion in 2016.

In Brazil freight depends on costly road haulage, few railroads or use of waterways. Ports and airports are congested and huge distances to cross the country are a commercial concern.




India – overstressed power grid and daily power loss disrupts port and business operations regularly. It can take 3.5 days for a ship to unload and load in Indian ports compared to 8 hours in Hong Kong. Hong Kong port handled 22M containers last year vs. India's largest at 3.8M.

Global Cargo Theft Risk







Cargo theft up 13% from 2011 - 881 cargo thefts recorded in 2012 Q1 & Q2

Most US based insurance companies will not insure cargo, trucks, or trailers once they enter Mexico.








Theft & Corruption — Brazil






Target high value loads - in 2011 average value was 471k per load


Trend 1 – Cargo criminals steal multiple trailers at once – increasing their take-per-theft ratio and lowering their risk of exposure.

Trend 3 – Identity theft of legit trucking companies is on the rise and the area of largest concern among shippers









Jury Returns \$23.7 Million Verdict Against C.H. Robinson

March 20, 2009 - An Illinois jury awarded a \$23.7 million judgment against freight broker C.H. Robinson Worldwide and other defendants for an interstate collision that killed two people and injured five others in April 2004.

The driver and carrier for whom the driver worked admitted they were negligent and responsible for the damages caused by their actions. The driver was was charged with driving on a suspended license and falsifying her log book.

Plaintiffs argued the driver was C.H. Robinson's agent, and C.H. Robinson should be liable for damages resulting from the carrier's negligence. The jury reached a verdict that the driver was C.H. Robinson's agent and awarded plaintiffs \$23,750,000.



Hiring Carriers with Due Diligence

Hiring motor carriers has always presented problems to brokers, 3PLs and shippers, but these problems have recently escalated as a result of the <u>Schramm</u> decision involving C.H. Robinson.

This monumental decision will change the way shippers and third parties qualify carriers for decades to come if they wish to avoid the risk of being held liable for the injuries, deaths and damages caused by the carriers they hire. It may also alert the government to the need for more accurate, current information on the nation's truckers their drivers and equipment.

Schramm is all about "due diligence". It presents a guideline to everyone having a responsibility for selecting a carrier to transport a load over the highways. However, in this writer's opinion, the court's guidelines are unrealistic given the time constraints or third parties during a normal business day. It is particularly unmanageable during periods of truck and driver shortages.

Nevertheless, it presents a challenge for every entity that hires carriers to establish a corporate policy on qualifying carriers that balances due diligence with reason and current conditions in the marketblace.
